

The need



- 1. African problems need African solutions, led by African scientists
 - Triple burden of infectious disease, NCDs and malnutrition
- 2. Understanding of health and social outcomes hindered by not exploring the full range of human diversity
 - Africa is most diverse continent on earth genomic, cultural, social, environmental
 - Current absence of large scale population based data
- 3. Covid19 shown need for political and scientific cooperation stretching far beyond national borders
 - And shown that this cooperation is possible


The opportunity



- Address the specific disease burden in Africa and inform African-specific interventions to improve health and social outcomes
- Utilise the unique diversity of the Continent to enable world-leading discovery research "for Africa and the world"
- Enable African scientists to lead the next phase of discovery science and be the ones who bring this critical new knowledge to the world
- Leverage existing infrastructure and capacity in Africa to maximise and accelerate health and social returns

VISION: Large scale data from Africa is used to change policy and practice to improve health and social outcomes, to contribute towards achieving the SDGs, and to strengthen African-led science.

Mechanism: population data platform - network of large longitudinal population studies including biobanks linked to routine health, social and environmental data where possible.



Phase 1: Scoping phase

March – December 2020

Phase 2: Formative phase

Jan 2021 - March/June 2023

Phase 3: Implementation

2023 - onwards

Wellcome Trust approves funding for formative phase

- Funders decide on investment for APCC
- Establish funding partnerships

Consultation:

- Steering Group of African scientists representing broad range of scientific disciplines
- Uganda Scoping meeting (March 2020)
- Cross-Wellcome working group
- International funders' group

Outcomes:

 APCC Scoping Report: rationale, broad scientific vision and high level structure

Engagement with new funders

Open call Research Proposals:

- African-led organisation and/or Consortium (researchers, policy makers)
- Timescale: 15-18 months
- Outcome: blueprint of APCC

Open call for APCC sites with an initial pilot phase

Outcome: Successful sites start Consortium

Request for Proposals to run the Formative phase

Formative phase

Purpose: design the blueprint for what APCC will achieve, how it will be structured, and how much it will cost.

- African-led organisation and/or Consortium (researchers, policy makers, etc.)
- Timescale: 15-18 months
- Outcome: blueprint of APCC

APCC blueprint (1)


Research vision and objectives:

- focus research vision in Scoping report on smaller set of ambitious yet feasible objectives
- finalise research domains and cross-cutting themes
- agree core data for each research domain
- develop framework to ensure translation and policy uptake
- Stakeholder engagement: engage diverse range of APCC stakeholders at an early stage to ensure that all relevant groups meaningfully co-develop the blueprint and later implement APCC
- Link to relevant current and new initiatives in Africa and globally
- Structure and components of APCC:
 - Individual LPS Core and Affiliate sites
 - Coordinating Hub(s)
 - Biobanks and 'omics platform
 - Data linkages

APCC blueprint (2)

- Governance and management structure of APCC
- Open Science and data sharing, and ethical principles
- Capacity and leadership platform that makes best use of APCC infrastructure to develop, strengthen and retain research, policy and translational skills in Africa; leverage existing initiatives avoiding duplication
- Evaluation framework and audit criteria
- Risks and mitigation strategies
- Cost estimates to establish within each of the above items the 'minimum viable product' to get APCC off the ground and the costs of add-on projects. Provide long-term sustainability plans which should include national and local political buy-in
- Branding materials (including a new name?)

Expressions of Interest: 14 May 2021

Shortlisting meeting (funders): expect to shortlist 3-5 applications

Process

Full proposals: 12 August 2021

Applicants' interviews by an Advisory Committee (funders & external experts)

Funders decision: October 2021

Expressions of Interest (EoI) criteria

deadline 14 May 2021

- 1. Applicants: African-led, multidisciplinary and diverse team
 - inclusive and diverse teams with broad geographical representation will be rated more highly
 - population data science expertise is a requirement
 - expertise of successfully delivering complex and highly collaborative initiatives
- 2. High level summary of how the team will approach delivering the formative phase as specified in the Request for Proposals (RFP)
- 3. Non-binding cost estimate: detail of eligible costs in RFP document

Aims of the shortlisting

- To identify the EoIs that reach minimum expectations and demonstrate potential to deliver the formative phase
- Identify specific gaps that can be successfully addressed in a full application. Applicants will be asked to address any identified gaps in the full application.

Full application criteria

deadline 12 August 2021 (invited applicants only)

- 1. Applicants: African-led, multidisciplinary and diverse team, expertise of successfully delivering complex and highly collaborative initiatives
- 1. Strength of the proposed approach to deliver the requirements set out in the RFP:
 - Proposal responds to all elements of the RFP
 - Stakeholder engagement, demonstrate co-production of APCC's blueprint
 - Appropriateness of methods used: use of best practice and encourage innovation
 - Identify any gaps we have not covered in the RFP
- 2. Costs: value for money
 - Proposal is appropriately costed and feasible
 - All costs are justified
